

Enrolled in DSH Diversion Program Slots: Clients that are currently served with housing and other services in the DSH Diversion program.

Lost to Follow-Up: Clients who left the program with unknown outcome.

Transitioned to Non-ODR Permanent Supportive Housing: Clients who are discharged from the program to a non-ODR permanent housing – family, independent living, other permanent housing program.

Transitioned to ODR Permanent Housing Program: Clients who are discharged from the program and transitioned into an ODR permanent housing program.

Reincarcerated: Clients who are remanded from court, violated probation/court order, or charged with a new crime.

*Based on latest documented scenario during the quarter. Data represent on ODR participant's housing status during the reporting quarter.

[^]In recognition of the need to create diversion opportunities, the California State Legislature passed Assembly Bill (AB) 1810 and Senate Bill (SB) 215 (2018) which amended Penal Code (PC) Sections 1001.35-1001.36 to create a way for courts to authorize pre-trial diversion for individuals with serious mental disorders who are charged with certain felony or misdemeanor crimes. ODR receives funding from Department of State Hospitals from March 1, 2019 to June 30, 2024. After June 30, 2024, this data set will be combined with the FIST program.
